

# COMPOUND ADJECTIVES

Use a hyphen (-) to join the two words that describe a thing or a person and eliminate the plural to form COMPOUND ADJECTIVES. Look at the example:

“I live in an **apartment**. It has **two bedrooms**.”

“I live in a **two-bedroom apartment**.”

- a) I live in a country house that has seven rooms.
- b) It's a penthouse that has six bedrooms.
- c) A house that has eight rooms is for sale.
- d) I live in an apartment in Duque de Caxias. It has one bedroom.
- e) My office is fifteen minutes away. I can walk to work.
- f) I live with my family in a house that has three garages.
- g) I have a big family. My family has seven members.
- h) I live in a small apartment. It has two bedrooms.
- i) I live in a farm. It has three barns.
- j) I have a girlfriend. She is 24 years old.
- k) The car is big. It has seven seats.
- l) The building is very tall. It has thirty stories.
