

Demonstrative pronouns & demonstrative adjectives

When **this, these, that, those** are used as adjectives they modify nouns and they are called demonstrative adjectives. When they are used alone, they are called demonstrative pronouns. For example:

Demonstrative adjective I have this jacket.



Demonstrative pronoun I have this.

Remember

We use **this** for singular and near things:

This white shirt



We use **these** for plural and near things:

These white shirts



We use **that** for singular and far things:

That black hat



We use **those** for plural and far things:

Those black hats
