### Let, Make, Have, Get

Form		Used	
Have	Have + object + verb	Give someone responsibility to do something	Next week I will <b>have</b> the mechanic examine my father's car.
Make	Make + object + verb	Force someone to do something	They <b>made</b> students obey the school rules.
Let	Let + object + verb	Allow/give permission for an action	The open window <b>let</b> the air escape.
Get	Get + person + to + verb	Convince someone to do something	Mark is so much in love with me, I can <b>get</b> him to do anything I want.
