#### A. Look at the uses of Present Perfect and Past Simple.

Present Perfect	Past Simple
<b>Unfinished actions that started in the past and continue to the present:</b>  I've known Julie for ten years (and I still know her).	<b>Finished actions:</b>  I knew Julie for ten years (but then she moved away and we lost touch).
<b>A finished action in someone's life (when the person is still alive: life experience):</b>  My brother has been to Mexico three times.	<b>A finished action in someone's life (when the person is dead):</b>  My great-grandmother went to Mexico three times.
<b>A finished action with a result in the present:</b>  I've lost my keys! (The result is that I can't get into my house now).	<b>A finished action with no result in the present:</b>  I lost my keys yesterday. It was terrible! (Now there is no result. I got new keys yesterday).
<b>With an unfinished time word (this week, this month, today):</b>  I've seen John this week.	<b>With a finished time word (last week, last month, yesterday):</b>  I saw John last week.
