1 syllable	cold	colder	<i>It's colder today than yesterday.</i>
	fine	finer	<i>She's a fine actor and an even finer dancer.</i>
	big	bigger	<i>This shirt is too small. I need a bigger one.</i>
2 syllables	busy	busier	<i>I have become busier recently.</i>
	narrow	narrower	<i>This new bed is narrower than the old one.</i>
	modern	modern	<i>Moderner equipment should be purchased for our work.</i>
3 syllables	interesting	more/less interesting	<i>The second lecture was more interesting than the first.</i>
	complicated	more/less complicated	<i>That way of calculating the figures seems less complicated to me.</i>

- Comparative Forms of Irregular Adjectives

Adjectives	Comparative forms	Example
bad	worse	<i>The weather got worse during the day.</i>
far	farther/further	<i>We had walked further than I had realized.</i>

good	better	<i>The morning flight is better than the afternoon one.</i>
old	older/elder	<i>His elder sister works for the government.</i>

- Farther or further?

Talk about	Farther	Further	Example
Distance	x	x	<i>How much farther/further are we going?</i>
Addition		x	<i>For further information, please ring 090 123 4567.</i>
Higher level		x	<i>She's gone to a college of further education.</i>
More		x	<i>I do not propose to discuss it any further.</i>

- Elder or older?

Used/talk about	Elder	Older	Example
As a noun	x	x	<i>Jack is the eldest of four brothers. Matt is the oldest of our children and Simon is the youngest.</i>
Before a noun	x	x	<i>Let me introduce Siga. She's my elder sister. The older man is my father.</i>
Age of things generally		x	<i>The town hall is by far the oldest building in the whole region.</i>

After a linking verb		x	<i>I think her grandfather must be older than her grandmother.</i>
After <i>to be</i>		x	<i>She is much older than me.</i>
Relationships within a family	x		<i>I am the eldest member of the family.</i>

2. Comparative Forms of Adverbs

	Adverbs	Comparative forms	Examples
1 syllable	soon	sooner	<i>They came sooner than us.</i>
	hard	harder	<i>Teachers always say that students must work harder.</i>
	early	earlier	<i>We should set off earlier to avoid traffic jam.</i>
	late	later	<i>She got married later than me.</i>
	fast	faster	<i>Children learn things faster than adults.</i>
	near	nearer	<i>As New Year is getting nearer, everyone is becoming busier.</i>
	far	farther/further	<i>Go farther and discover the world yourself!</i>
	carefully	more/less carefully	<i>He drives more carefully than I do.</i>

2 syllables or more	beautifully	more/less beautifully	<i>She dances more beautifully than anyone I have known.</i>
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- We use *than* when we mention the second person or thing in the comparison.

Example:

*I can't keep up with him – he runs much faster **than** me.*

*My wife drives more carefully **than** I do.*

Adverbs	Comparative forms	Examples
well	better	<i>Marry speaks English better than I can.</i>
badly	worse	<i>The weather got worse during the day.</i>
