Uses	Examples
Definite time in the past	We left home at the end of November.
Single or habitual events or states in the past	She ran out and she phoned my brother. She looked a bit worried.
Sometimes there is no time expression when the past simple is used	Do you know John? She was in my English class at this center.
Past simple and the order of events	I got into the room and turned on the light.

eat	ate	<i>I ate a loaf of bread this morning.</i>
fly	flew	<i>They flew from Beijing to London.</i>
have	had	<i>I had such a good time with you.</i>
know	knew	<i>She knew me well.</i>
read	read	<i>I read this novel last week.</i>
sing	sang	<i>Her brother sang a good song at the party.</i>
tell	told	<i>She told me the truth.</i>
write	wrote	<i>He wrote to me last month.</i>

(+)	I, you, we, they	have	played
	he, she, it	has	played
(-)	I, you, we, they	have not/ haven't	played
	he, she, it	has not/ hasn't	played
(?+)	Have	I, you, we, they	played?
	Has	he, she, it	played?
(?-)	Haven't	I, you, we, they	played?
	Hasn't	he, she, it	played?

Uses	Examples
Experiences up to now	She has never said sorry for what she did.
Recent completed events	Niki and John have just come back from a week in Spain.
Past events, present results	She has broken her arm in two places. (Her arm is still broken now.)
Time + for and since	I have learnt English since 2010. They have moved here for 2 years.
How long ...?	How long have you been in Vietnam?
Just, yet, already	They have just built a bridge there. I haven't finished my homework yet. She has already written him a letter.
