

CONDITIONAL CLAUSES

ZERO: IF + PRESENT SIMPLE + PRESENT SIMPLE

If I **feel** all right, I **don't go** to the doctor.

FIRST: IF + PRESENT SIMPLE + FUTURE SIMPLE / IMPERATIVE / MODAL

If I **know** anything before Tuesday, I **will phone** you.

SECOND: IF + PAST SIMPLE + CONDITIONAL SIMPLE (WOULD)

If I **knew** the answer, I **wouldn't ask** you.

THIRD: IF + PAST PERFECT + CONDITIONAL PERFECT (WOULD HAVE)

If I **had known** all the answers, I **wouldn't have failed** the exam.
