1. Go over the grammar rule for the past simple and continuous

We use **Past Progressive** to talk about long actions in the past.

We use **Past Simple** to talk about short events that happened during, or interrupted, the longer action.

I **was sitting** in the shade of the tree when one woman **stopped** and **looked** at me.

We use **while** before the longer action:

While the archeologists were excavating the site, they found a hidden chamber.

We use **when** to introduce the shorter action:

The kids were playing on the beach **when** the storm started.

We never use **when** and **while** in the same sentence.
