Multiple births happen when more than one baby is born to the same woman at the same time. Twins are an example of a multiple birth; so are triplets (three babies born at the same day), quadruplets (four babies), and quintuplets (five babies). How common are they? In Australia, twins are born in about 1 out of 80 birth and triplets in about 1 out of 6400 births. In the United States, twins are born in about 1 out of 33 births. Triplets are born in about 1 out of 33 births. Triplets are born in about 1 out of 585 births. In 2001, 1 out of about 47,000 births was quintuplets—or more.

Twins usually have the same birthday. But more twins are born on different days. And in late December 1999, some twins were born in two different centuries--- one twin in 1999, and one in the 2000.
