| plain     |             | A large body of water flowing down from a mountain and empties into an ocean or sea. |
| mountain  |             | A piece of land completely surrounded by waters.                                     |
| Peninsula |             | A piece of land jutting far out into the sea and is almost surrounded by water       |
| Island    |             | Land that is flat or almost flat                                                     |
| River     |             | The low ground between two hills or mountains                                        |
