FOR + ING (PARA, FUNCIÓN) – This knife is for cutting meat

FOR + NOUN (A POR) – I stopped at the supermarket for milk

FOR + SOMEBODY + TO + INFINITIVE (PARA QUE....) – There aren't any tickets for us to buy
