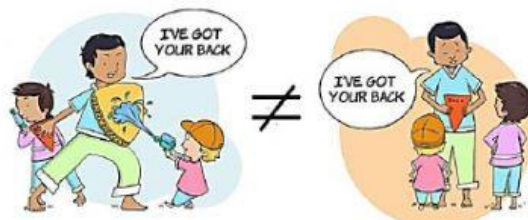

- e. To be timid, to be hesitant to do something, to back out of a commitment, to lose heart or to lose courage.

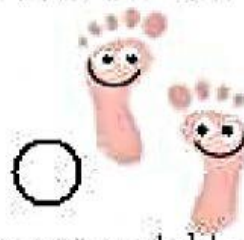

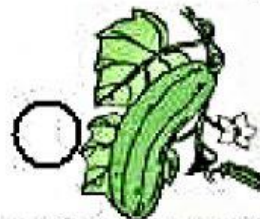
