Jane Austen was born on 16 December 1775, in Hampshire, England. She had seven brothers and sisters, and her family was very close. Many people believe that parts of her novels were autobiographical, because she wrote about family and society at that time. She published her first novel, *sense of sensibility*, in 1811. Two years later, she published her second novel, *pride and prejudice*. This novel is one of the most famous novels in the world, and many books and films are based on the story.

Joanne (J.K) Rowling was born in Gloucestershire, England, on 31st July 1965. She always loved reading, and when she was young, she often wrote stories to tell her little sister. In 1990, J.K Rowling was on a train when she had the idea for a most famous character: an orphan who becomes a wizard. She started writing the first *Harry Potter* as soon as she got home. *The Harry Potter* books and films were huge success. J.K Rowling is the first person to become a billionaire by writing books.
