Step 2: Read the story about the the Dulce Apartments. Underline the *present perfect* (has/have + past participle) forms of the verb.



The Dulce Apartments has always been a nice place to live. Residents have always felt safe and respected at the Dulce. Children have been allowed to play outside on the grass. All of the managers at the Dulce have been friendly, and they have always helped make repairs on time.

But recently things have changed at the Dulce Apartments. Since Sam, the new manager, arrived, life has become difficult. Sam has said that the children can't play outside anymore. Sam has also refused to make basic repairs. Even worse, Sam has raised the rent two times. But the worst thing Sam has done since coming to the Dulce is that he has forced three families to leave their apartments.

No one knows for sure why Sam has forced these families to leave. But the Dulce Apartments Tenants' Association thinks it knows why. They think it has to do with discrimination and they plan to do something about it.



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Step 1: Use the *present perfect* (have/has + past participle) to write about how things have change since Sam came to the Dulce Apartments.



Since Sam came to the Dulce Apartments,

1. He has raised (raise) the rent three times.
2. He refuse (refuse) to make basic repairs.
3. He stop (stop) the children from playing on the grass.
4. He force (force) three families to leave the building.

Step 2: Use the *present perfect* (have/has + past participle) to write about what the tenants have done since Sam came to the Dulce.



Since Sam came to the Dulce Apartments,

1. The tenants organize (organize) two emergency meetings.
2. They talk (talk) about how to resolve the problems at the Dulce.
3. They talk (talk) to the owner of the building.
4. They file (file) a complaint with their local housing office.
5. They ask (ask) for help at a local community-based organization.
