Across Africa, elephants are losing their habitats because more land each year is used for farming. As elephants walk across farmland looking for food and water, they sometimes damage farm buildings and eat farm crops. Consequently, many farmers consider elephants a significant problem, and scientists think that the conflict between farmers and elephants is just going to get worse. However,

a project called the Elephants and Bees Project, which started in Kenya, is going to help both elephants and farmers. The project will help local farmers keep bees on fences around their farms. Elephants are scared of bees, so they will stop walking across the farms. Instead, they will take different routes away from the bees and away from the farms. This might be just enough to stop the conflict.

It sounds like a great solution because it's easy to do, it isn't expensive, and it isn't cruel to the elephants. It means farmers and elephants will be able to live side by side, and both elephants and people will be safe.
