### GRAMMAR HELP

#### PRESENT CONTINUOUS

1. We use **must** to say that something is **necessary** or **very important**.
2. We use **must not** (**mustn't**) to say that something is **not allowed**.

| Subject | Auxiliary Verb | Main Verb |                     |
|---------|----------------|-----------|---------------------|
| I       | must           | go        | home.               |
| He      | must not       | spend     | all his money.      |
| You     | mustn't        | buy       | unnecessary things. |

3. We use **should** and **should not** (**shouldn't**) to show a kind of **obligation, duty** or **correctness**.

| Subject | Auxiliary Verb | Main Verb |         |
|---------|----------------|-----------|---------|
| You     | should         | spend     | wisely. |
| They    | shouldn't      | shop      | there.  |

Note: **Must** is a stronger word than **should**.
