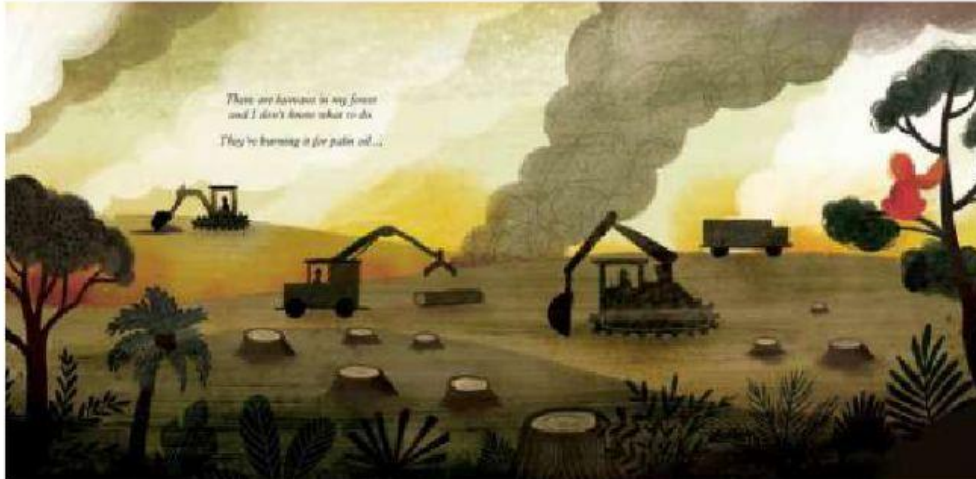

1. Stanza and Line

Line: A line of poetry is not like a sentence. Just because the words are one line, it doesn't mean that the complete thought is finished.

When reading poetry, and you reach the end of the line and there is no punctuation after the last word, do not pause – continue reading as you would any sentence.

Stanza: is one of the divisions of a poem composed of two or more lines usually characterized by a common pattern of meter, rhyme, and number of lines.

Stanzas name according the number of lines:

- Monostich: 1 line stanza
- Couple: 2 Lines
- Tercet: 3 lines
- Quatrain: 4 lines
- Quintain: 5 lines
- Sestet: 6 lines
- Septet: 7 lines
- Octave: 8 lines

at the tip of his nose with phenomenal ease

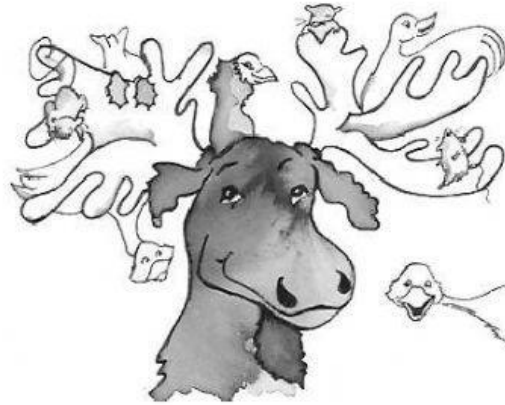


3. He'd buy food in bulk at incredible prices
