
The passive voice is used to show interest in the person or object that experiences an action rather than the person or object that performs the action. In other words, the most important thing or person becomes the subject of the sentence.

The name of the award, "The Oscar", is disputed. The most widely accepted story is that it was named after Oscar Pierce, the cousin of Margaret Herrick, the first executive secretary of the Academy.

Currently there are 24 different categories including Best Actor, Best Supporting Actor, Best Actress, Best Supporting Actress, Best International Feature Film, Best Original Score, and Best Original Song.
