Halloween is a traditional celebration held on October 31st. Today, Halloween is an excuse for Halloween theme costume parties. Many children **dress up** in fancy costumes and **visit** other homes in the neighborhood. Sometimes, children go "trick or treating" - knocking on doors and they **demand** sweets, snacks or a small gift. If they **do not get** this, they **threaten** to do some harm to the inhabitants of the house. This is known as playing 'trick-or-treat' and is supposed to happen in a friendly spirit. families Also decorate **their** house with skull, skeletons, lanterns.

Día de Muertos **becomes** more familiar to the rest of the world thanks to the movie Coco from Disney. In the 1st and 2nd of November, Mexico and parts of Latin America celebrate *Día de los Muertos* (also known as *Day of the Dead*) to honor their ancestors. It is believed that the Gates between Heaven and Earth **open up** at midnight on October 31 and the souls of children **return** to Earth to be reunited with their families for 24 hours. The souls of adults also **come down** from heaven to join in the festivities on November 2. on this holyday Mexicans remember and honor their deceased loved ones. Mexicans **visit** cemeteries, **decorate** the graves, and **spend** time there, in the presence of their deceased friends and family members. They also **make** elaborately decorated altars (called ofrendas) in their homes to welcome the spirits. The Ofrendas **usually have** candles, bright marigolds called cempasuchil and red cock's combs alongside food like stacks of tortillas and fruit.
