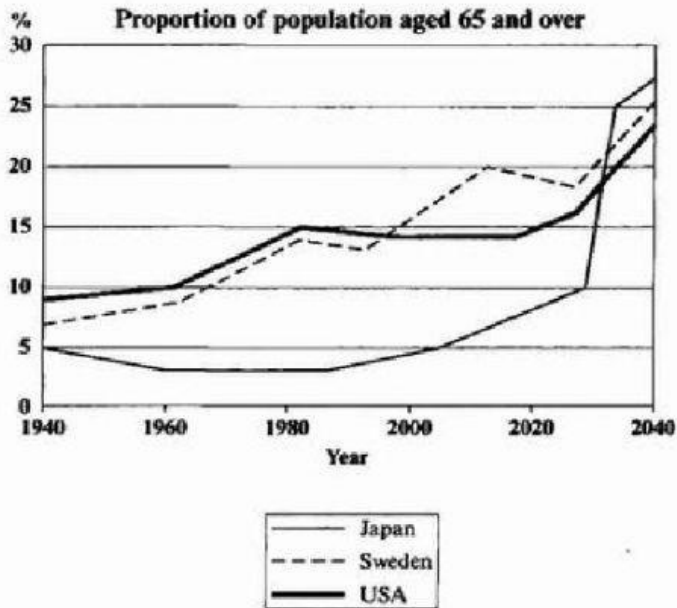

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The line graph _____ the _____ of people in three countries who used the Internet between 1999 and 2009.

It is clear that the proportion of the population who used the Internet _____ in each country over the period shown. Overall, a much larger percentage of Canadians and Americans had access to the Internet in comparison with Mexicans, and Canada _____ the fastest _____ in Internet usage.

In 1999, the proportion of people using the Internet in the USA was about 20%. The figures for Canada and Mexico were lower, at about 10% and 5% respectively. In 2005, Internet usage in both the USA and Canada rose to around 70% of the population, while the figure for Mexico _____ just over 25%.

By 2009, the percentage of Internet users was _____ in Canada. Almost 100% of Canadians used the Internet, compared to about 80% of Americans and only 40% of Mexicans.

The line graph _____ the percentage of people aged 65 or more in three countries over a period of 100 years.

It is clear that the proportion of elderly people _____ in each country between 1940 and 2040. Japan is expected to see the most _____ changes in its elderly population.

In 1940, around 9% of Americans were aged 65 or over, compared to about 7% of Swedish people and 5% of Japanese people. The proportions of elderly people in the USA and Sweden _____ gradually over the next 50 years, _____ just under 15% in 1990. By contrast, the figures for Japan _____ below 5% until the early 2000s.

Looking into the future, a _____ increase in the percentage of elderly people is predicted for Japan, with a jump of over 15% in just 10 years from 2030 to 2040. By 2040, it is thought that around 27% of the Japanese population will be 65 years old or more, while the figures for Sweden and the USA will be _____ lower, at about 25% and 23% respectively.
