It describes in logical sequence, how the study was designed, carried out and who the participants were. It provides enough detail so that an experiment could be repeated.

METHODS

It starts with a brief summary what was really found and why it is important. It also discusses limitations of your study.

RESULTS

Supply sufficient background information to allow the reader to understand and evaluate the results of the present study without needing to refer to previous studies on the topic. It also describe the problem or situation that motivates the research.

DISCUSSION

It contains only the findings, not any explanation or commentary. Its function to provide answers to questions that are posed in the introduction.
