

GRAMMAR

Present Simple

Affirmative: (ir)regular verb

I **live** in an apartment.

He/She/It **lives** in an apartment.

You/We/They **live** in an apartment.

Negative: do not (don't) does not (doesn't)

I **don't live** in an apartment.

He/She/It **doesn't live** in an apartment.

You/We/They **don't live** in an apartment.

Questions

Do live in an apartment?

Does he/she/it **live** in an apartment?

Do you/ we/ they **live** in an apartment?

Note:

1) Note: Add -s with a verb after he/she/it.

2) If a verb ends in -ch, -o, sh, or -ss, we add -es after he/she/it.

3) If a verb ends in a consonant (b, c, etc.) + y (eg. Study) we cancel y then use -ies after he/she/it.

Sandra: (9) (He/have) a big lunch as well?

Kathy: (10) (I/not/know). (11) (He/not/tell) me.

Sandra: (12) (you/drive) to work?

Kathy: Yes. (13) (there/not/be) any buses. What about you?
