MUSTN'T




must / mustn't

Must is most commonly used to express certainty. It can also be used to express necessity or strong recommendation.

Example:

This **must** be the right answer.
You **must** study hard .



must / mustn't

must not = mustn't can be used to prohibit actions.

Example:

You **mustn't** kick the ball when you play basketball.



must / mustn't

He **must** do his homework.

helmet.
