What are nouns?

A noun is a word used to identify **a person**, **a place**, **an animal**, or **a thing**.

What are countable Nouns?

Countable nouns are nouns that we **can count**. They **can** be plural.

SINGULAR	PLURAL	SPELLING
a student an apple	students apples	➔ general rule add -s
a bus a box	buses boxes	➔ after -s, -ch, -sh, -x, -o add -es
a baby a country	babies countries	➔ after consonant + -y delete -y and add -ies
a day a toy	days toys	➔ after -ay, -ey, -oy add -s
a shelf a wife	shelves wives	➔ after -f or -fe delete -f or -fe and add -ves

What are uncountable nouns?

Uncountable nouns are nouns that we **can't count**. They **can't** be plural, **they are always singular**.
