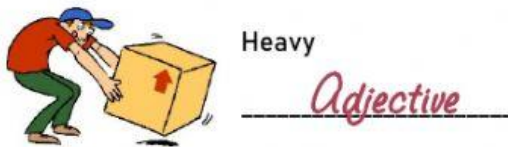


## Lesson 9. Adverbial Phrases
