The History of 911

911 was born as 999 in the UK. It was chosen because it was almost impossible to **dial** it by mistake on old pulse-dial phones. The number 911 was designated in the 1950s in Canada, and years later in the US by the fire departments to **ensure** public safety. Firefighters didn't want people to call different numbers for different emergencies. They wanted to give a centralized public health service. They chose 911 because it was easy to remember, easy to dial, and had never been used.

The number 911 is not the emergency number around the world. In Europe, you must dial 112, in China and Hong Kong 999, in Australia 000, in New Zealand 111, in Bolivia 118, and in Brazil 192. In many other countries, there are different emergency numbers.

In summary, there is a centralized number to handle emergencies in every country. Therefore, if you travel to another country, you should ask for what number to dial in an emergency since that information can save your life.
