

The Passive Voice

A passive sentence consist of;

- The subject
- The verb to be in the correct tense.
- The past participle of the verb needed.
- Sometimes, the agent and/or other complements

Subject + verb + "to be" + Past participle

The Active Voice tells us what the subject of a sentence does or did.

The Passive Voice creates a new subject. We use the passive voice when we want to emphasize **who** does or did an action.



Present and Past Passive Structures

Simple Present Passive

am/is/are + past participle (+ by + noun)

Simple Past Passive

was/were + past participle (+ by + noun)

The tasks are explained by the teacher

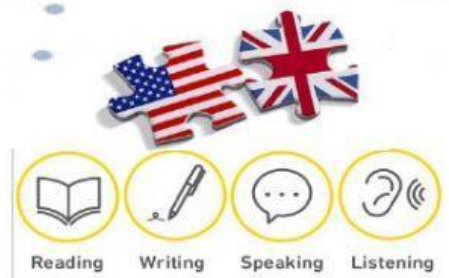
Simple Past Passive
