River

is a large body of water flowing down from a mountain side and empties into an ocean or sea



Swamp

is a piece of land that is completely surrounded by water



Island

is a flat area of land where the ground is waterlogged (filled with water). The land is also very muddy.



Hill

is a piece of land jutting far out into the sea and is almost surrounded by water



Plain

is a place on the Earth's surface that is higher than the land around it. It is much taller than a hill.



Mountain

is land that rises above the surrounding land and can reach a height of 300 metres



Peninsula

is the low ground between two hills or mountains



Valley

is land that is flat or almost flat
