OTHERS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This presentation can be done individually or in pairs. • It will add a maximum of 0.5 in your 2nd term final mark, or a maximum of 0.2 if you are recording your presentation. • In your ppt/canva/prezi,... (if needed), there must be no full sentences, only pictures and very concrete information, such as quantities, years, key words.
