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HOW TO PRONOUNCE -ed AT THE END OF A VERB

There are **three different ways** to pronounce the 'ed' ending of regular verbs in the simple past tense: /ɪd/, /t/ or /d/. The pronunciation depends on **the sound at the end of the infinitive of the verb**.

/ɪd/	/t/	/d/
This is the least common -ed sound	-Words that end in /p/, /k/, /f/, /s/, /sh/, /ch/ <u>sound</u> :	This is the most common -ed sound
-Words that end in /t/ or /d/ sound:	Kissed /kɪst/ Laughed /la:ft/ Asked /a:skt/ Stopped /stɒpt/ Watched /wɒtʃt/ Washed /wɒʃt/	-Words that end in any other sound :
Wanted /'wɒn.tɪd/ Needed /'ni:.dɪd/ Started /sta:tɪd/ Decided /dɪ'saɪ.dɪd/	Closed /kləʊzd/ Saved /seɪvd/ Travelled /'træv.əld/ Opened /'əʊ.pənd/ Climbed /klaɪmd/
