folk tales	- is created by and exists only in the mind
imaginary	- stories in which main roles are played by animals
fantasy	- books, films, or cartoons about an imagined future, especially about space travel or other planets
protagonist	- the time and the place in which the action of a book, film, play, etc. happens
author	- a type of story or literature that is set in an imaginary world, often involving traditional myths and magical creatures and sometimes ideas or events from the real world, especially from the medieval period of history
settings	- an ancient story or set of stories, especially explaining the early history of a group of people or about natural events and facts
fairy tales	- a story that parents have passed on to their children through speech over many years
genre	- any large or small living thing that can move independently
animal stories	- a long printed story about imaginary characters and events. Can be mysteries, romance, thrillers, science fiction, fantasy, historical fiction etc.
fairies	- a style, especially in the arts, that involves a particular set of characteristics
unexplainable	- the writer of a book, article, play, etc.
chapter	- any of the separate parts into which a book or other piece of text is divided, usually given a number or title
sci-fi	- the type of book or story that is written about imaginary characters and events and not based on real people and facts
fiction	- an imaginary creature with magic powers, usually represented as a very small person with wings
creature	- strange and frightening story
novel	- one of the main characters in a story or a play
spooky stories	- a traditional story written for children that usually involves imaginary creatures and magic
myths	- are ones for events, behavior etc. which people do not know or understand the reason
