
AM I A GOOD CITIZEN?

We hear the word citizen all the time, but some people don't know what it really means. Let's get into it! (Have – is – think – need)

First, let's talk about what a citizen is. A citizen **is** a person who is part of a group, a school, a town, a city or a country. To be a citizen brings both privileges and obligations, you have rights and responsibilities too. So, we are all citizens because we belong to a group.



Second, let's talk about what a good citizen is. We consider a person to be a good citizen when he or she follows the rules and is a good element in the group.



A good citizen **should** always be respectful and **should** think about the well-being of the people in the group.



Finally, let's talk about teenagers as citizens. People **shouldn't** forget that teenagers' actions are important, and that we can make a society better or worse, too.

We also have responsibilities and rights, and we are also part of a group, a school, and a country. Teenagers are also citizens and we **should** be good citizens too.


