The United States is presently facing serious water problems. Rain and snow do not fall **evenly** across the country. The Northwest receives an abundance of rain, more than eighty inches each year in some areas. In contrast, parts of the West and Southwest receive less than ten inches per year. The Northeast and Midwest traditionally have had sufficient supplies of water, but recently both regions have begun to experience water shortages.

The Southwest receives its water from primarily two sources: large, underground reserves of water, called aquifers, and the 1,400-mile-long Colorado River. The aquifers, which were formed over thousands of years ago, are being consumed slowly but surely. More water is taken out than nature can replace.

The beautiful Colorado River has caused nearly as many fights in the West and Southwest as gold or whiskey ever did. This precious source of water flows through Wyoming, Utah, Nevada, California, and Mexico. Each of the seven states as well as Mexico has a legal right to a portion of **its** water; however, for years, California has been using not only its share of water but also a part of Arizona's to supply water for Los Angeles and the surrounding area. People from Arizona and the mountain states resent this and feel their water is being stolen. By the time the river actually reaches its goal, the Gulf of California, there is no longer much water left to fight over. After Mexico claims its ten percent share for irrigation, the once mighty Colorado becomes a **trickle** and gradually disappears into the sand.
