Aït Benhaddou

What is Aït Benhaddou?

Aït Benhaddou is a fortified village in Morocco. It is in the High Atlas Mountains next to the Ounila River. There is a high wall around the village and there are towers at the corners of the wall. Inside the wall, there are many buildings close together. The wall and the buildings are made from earth. People have to repair the earth buildings regularly because rain damages them.

Who built Aït Benhaddou?

The Berber tribes of North Africa built Aït Benhaddou. They built many towns and villages in the Atlas Mountains. There are over 1,000 villages in the area. Some families still live in the old village of Aït Benhaddou. Most people now live in a newer village on the other side of the river.

Why is Aït Benhaddou famous?

Aït Benhaddou is a very good example of southern Moroccan architecture. Most of the buildings inside the wall are houses. Some are simple but some look like small castles. There is also a mosque, a public square and a caravanserai. Aït Benhaddou is on the old trade route from Sudan to Marrakesh. Groups of travellers stayed in the caravanserai. Aït Benhaddou became a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1987. The village appears in many films. Scenes from *The Mummy* (1999), *Gladiator* (2000) and *Prince of Persia* (2010) are set here. Many tourists come to visit Aït Benhaddou.

READING III: Read the text below and complete the table. Choose ONE WORD from the passage for each answer.

The world's friendliest city

A team of social psychologists from California has spent six years studying the reactions of people in cities around the world to different situations. The results show that cities where people *have less* money generally have friendlier *populations*. Rio de Janeiro in Brazil, which is often *known* for its crime, comes out top, and the capital of Malawi, Lilongwe, comes third.

But what makes one city friendlier than another? The psychologists from California State University say it has got more to do with environment than culture or nationality.

They carried out a study into the way locals treated strangers in 23 cities around the world. The team conducted their research through a series of tests, where they dropped pens or pretended they were blind and needed help crossing the street.

The study concludes that people are more helpful in cities with a more relaxed *way of life* such as Rio. While they were there, researchers received help in 93 percent of cases, and the percentage in Lilong we was only a little lower. However, richer cities such as Amsterdam and New York are considered the least friendly. Inhabitants of Amsterdam helped the researchers in 53 percent of cases and in New York just 44 percent. The psychologists found that, in these cities, people tend to *be short of* time, so they hurry and often *ignore* strangers.
