

## Comparative adjectives

We use comparative adjectives to compare two things or people.

We use *than* after the comparative adjective. e.g. *My sister is shyer than my brother.*

	Adjective	+ comparative	- comparative
Regular adjectives	shy	shyer	less shy
Two syllable adjectives ending in -y	happy	happier	less happy
Two or more syllable adjectives	famous	more famous	less famous
Irregular adjectives	good bad	better worse	-

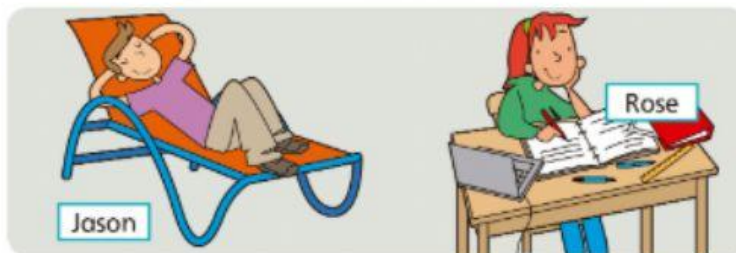
