We use *than* after the comparative adjective. e.g. *My sister is shyer than my brother.*

Two or more syllable adjectives	famous	more famous	less famous
Irregular adjectives	good bad	better worse	-

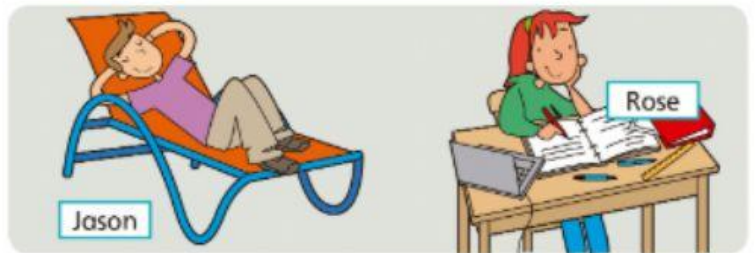
