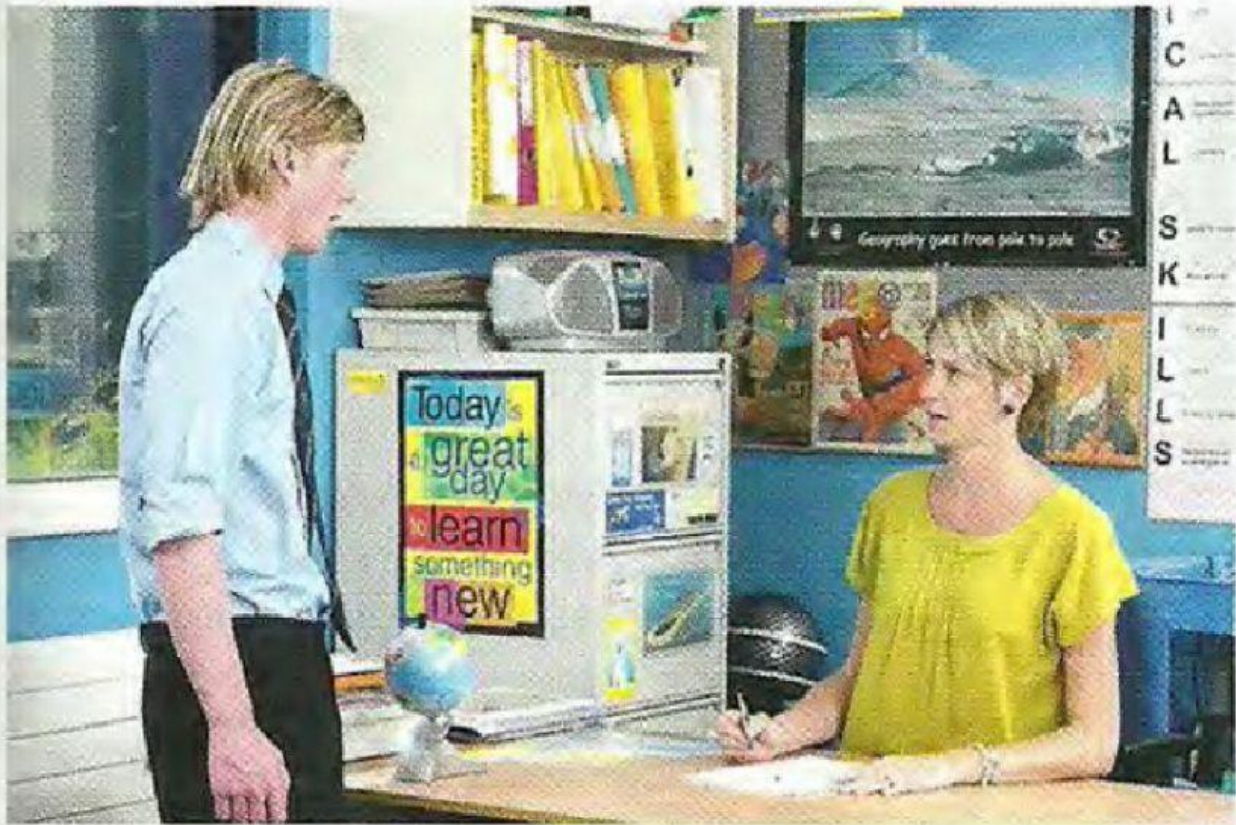


Complete with the correct form of the verb.
