The Sensitive Plant

Did you know that some plants can move?

The sensitive plant moves when you touch it. The stem has tiny white hairs, and it stands straight up. It grows to about 50 centimeters. It has many thin green leaves. Each thin leaf is made of many tiny parts. The parts are like tiny leaves. These tiny leaves grow on both sides of each leaf stem.

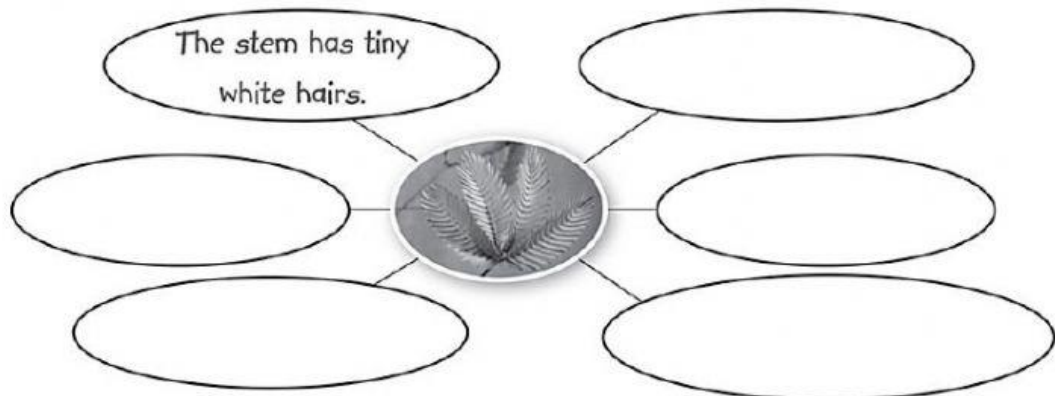
When you touch a leaf, the tiny leaves fold. Two by two, starting from where you touch, they close down. The leaf stem hangs down, too. It looks like it is hiding and doesn't want you to touch it. After a half hour, the plant stands up—until you touch it again!



- 1 Read** *The Sensitive Plant* in your Student's Book. How did the writer plan the writing? Read the steps below.

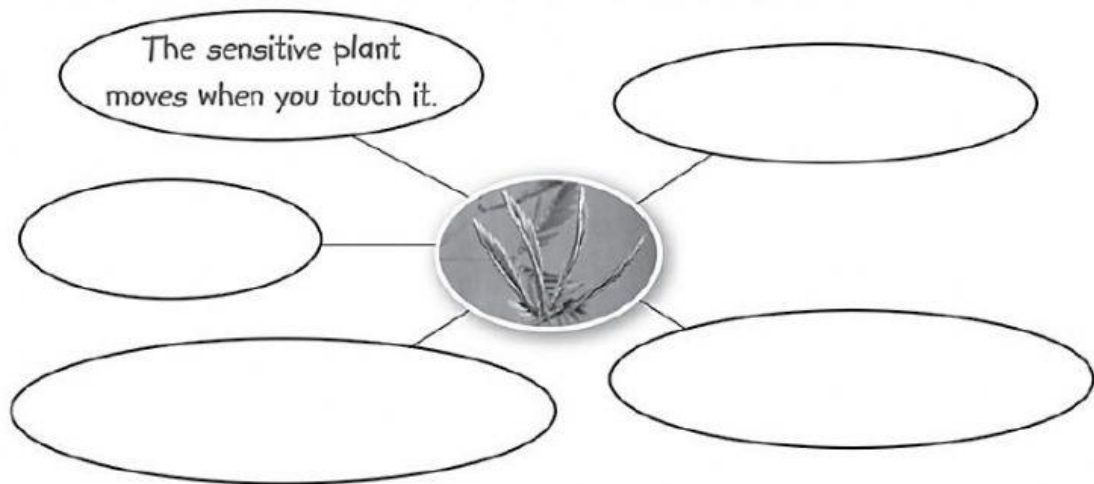
1. First, the writer chose a topic. What was the writer's topic?
