Modal verbs of probability

We use modal verbs of probability when we think about possible situations in the present.

It can't be a house. (I'm certain it's not true.)

It could be a museum. (Perhaps it's true.)

It might not be a shopping centre. (Perhaps it's not true.)

It must be a petrol station. (I'm certain it's true.)
