THE HIGHEST CITY IN THE WORLD
The city of El Alto in Spanish word meaning 'the highest' is the world's highest city at 4,120 m above sea level. It is Bolivia's second largest city, after Santa Cruz de la Sierra, and has a population of around one million. The South American country also has the world's highest capital city, La Paz.
