

CONNECTORS OF ADDITION

Used to add elements in a list

1. The most typical (and abused of) connector of addition is **and**.
2. **Furthermore,... = In addition,... = Plus,... = Besides,... = Additionally,...**
3. **Moreover, ...** (It normally supports a negative evaluation and is more formal than the others. Used to express addition in a more common way)
4. **What's more,...** (Used to express addition for the last element and reinforce it)

He's tall athletic., he's good-looking. I
think he's intelligent. And, he's rich!

 **Besides** can also be followed by a **gerund**
Besides being intelligent, he's good-looking!

As well = Too **Placed at the end of the sentence**

He loves jazz, and all his family love it = He loves jazz. All

Also **Placed before the principal verb (except verb TO BE) or at the beginning.**

He works as a clothes designer. { He works as a personal shopper
 , he works as a personal shopper

Added to...

Added to what you said, I would insist on the same idea.

In addition, = additionally,

The company provides cheap Internet access. In addition, it provides good service.
