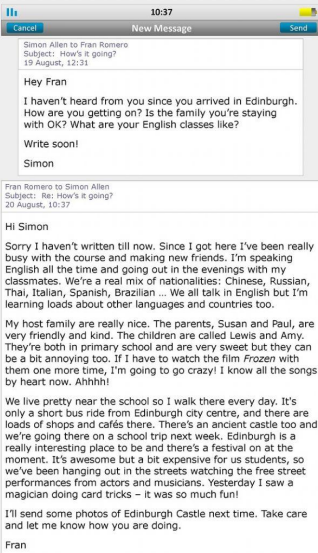


MID-TERM TEST (UNITS 1-4)
