

CAN / CAN'T

- Can – modal verb -> не меняет форму несмотря на местоимение
- Can = ability -> функция способности
- Can't / cannot = absence of ability -> отсутствие способности

I can ride a bike. = I have an ability of riding a bike.

I can't climb a mountain. = I have no ability of climbing a mountain.

- Can = possibility -> функция возможности

I can go out today because I don't have any classes tomorrow.

ADVERBS OF MANNER

- Adverbs of Manner (AM) – describe how we do something -> How? In what way? – Наречия образа действия -> описывают как было выполнено действие
- In sentence AM follow the action verb, NOT the verb "to be"
- AM are made of adjective + endings: -y, -ly, -lly, -ily

slow -> slowly careful -> carefully happy -> happily good -> well

* Irregular adverbs: long, high, wide, hard, near, late, far, low, straight, fast, early, deep -> имеют одинаковую форму как прилагательные и как наречия.

- games (with a ball) -> to play chess, to play basketball


We use verb **go** with:
