

Read the following passage about *The Snowy Owl* and do the exercises on the next page.

The Snowy Owl

When you see a snowy owl, it is clear how the bird probably got its name: they are snow-white. Males are generally whiter than females and as they grow older, they get whiter. The females never become completely white; they are a light brown colour.

These large owls mainly live in the Arctic in frozen, treeless areas. Snowy owls are very skilled hunters. They wait patiently for animals they want to hunt, such as mice, rabbits, birds, and fish. Snowy owls have excellent eyesight, but they cannot see much when an animal is under snow. Luckily, they also have excellent hearing and this sense is what they use most when they hunt. Most owls sleep during the day and hunt at night, but the snowy owl is the opposite; it is active during the day, especially in the summertime.

When a male snowy owl finds its female, they will stay together for life. Female snowy owls lay from 3 to 11 eggs at a time, in a nest which is built on the ground. When there is little food available, female snowy owls lay fewer eggs. If they do not find any animals to hunt, they will not lay any eggs at all.

Baby snowy owls are covered in soft white fur for the first days of their lives. As new feathers replace the fur, the birds become light brown. The young leave the nest when they are one month old. By this time, they can fly well, but their parents take care of them for another ten weeks or more.


