2. Read the text.

A Life in Television

He is one of the most famous television personalities in Britain. His career in television has lasted for over 60 years and he has written and presented some of the best natural history documentaries ever made, including the series *Life on Earth*. His name? Sir David Attenborough.

David was born in 1926 in London, but grew up in Leicester. He became interested in natural history at an early age and loved collecting things like stones and fossils. He never lost this interest and when he left school, he studied geology and zoology at the University of Cambridge.

After graduating in 1947, he spent two years in the navy and then worked for a short time editing science textbooks for children. However, he didn't like the work and in 1950 he applied for a job at the BBC. At the time, like most people in Britain, he himself didn't have a television set. He joined the BBC in 1952 but at first, he didn't appear on any shows because Mary Adams, his boss, thought his teeth were too big! This changed when he made and helped to present a series called *The Pattern of Animals*. After that, he made a number of shows on different subjects.

In 1965 Attenborough became Controller of BBC Two. At the time, this channel was not popular, but he changed all that and introduced shows about sports, business, music, the arts, entertainment, science, natural history, etc. He also introduced color television to Britain. In 1969 he was given responsibility for the shows on both BBC channels. Then in 1972 he was offered the top job at the BBC, but he didn't want to take it. He was more interested in making and presenting shows. So he left the BBC and made shows. These were different from most other documentaries at the time: they were serious, but not boring and audiences loved them.

In his eighties, Attenborough continues to appear on television and he has millions of fans all over the world.
