Christmas Celebrations in Britain

Every year in December people around the world celebrate Christmas on December 25th. Christmas celebrations in Britain also include the Advent (four Sundays before Christmas), Christmas Eve (December 24th), the Queen's message (on Christmas Day) and Boxing Day (December 26th).

According to the church calendar, the Advent is the official beginning of the Christmas run-up. The Advent is marked by the Advent calendar and the Advent candles. The Advent candle can be a candle with 25 marks on it, 24 candles for each night from December 1st through Christmas Eve, or four candles for the four weeks before Christmas.

On Christmas Eve, some people spend the night singing, being in the church or going out with their friends or family. For young children, Christmas Eve is the time when Father Christmas or Santa comes and brings them presents. Traditionally, before going to bed, stockings are left out for Santa and in the morning the children will check the stockings for presents.

The main celebration, Christmas Day, is the time for gift giving and family gathering. The average family starts opening presents around 8 o'clock and then they sit down for breakfast. After that, they could attend church or cook a big Christmas dinner, which is usually served around 3 or 4 o'clock with the traditional turkey as the main menu.

Another ritual on Christmas Day is watching the Queen's speech. The tradition began in 1932 by King George V and continues to this day. The Queen's message is shown on television and most people in Britain watch it while enjoying their Christmas dinner.

Boxing Day is on December 26th when people open the Christmas box and share the contents with the poor. Boxing Day is a bank holiday and a long time ago it is known as a shopping holiday as many shops open very early and offer sales.
