

CONDITIONALS	if clause (condition)	main clause (result)
1st conditional used for future real/factual situations	present simple If I <u>study</u> hard,	will + base verb I <u>will</u> pass my exams.
2nd conditional used for present or future unreal, imaginary situations	past simple If I <u>studied</u> hard,	would + base verb I <u>would</u> pass my exams.
