if you **don't** study.

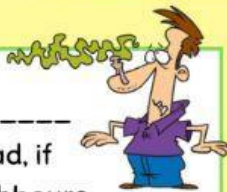

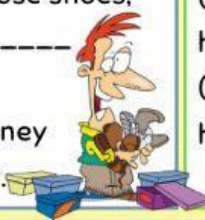
