

Two mothers are discussing vaccines.

Choose the correct answers to complete their conversation.

Ann: Hi, have your kids been **related to / vaccinated** yet? I hear all the **parental / pre-school** kids have to be or they won't let them attend the daycare programs.

Kim: I'm not sure about the **flu / fluent** vaccine. I've heard it isn't that effective. A lot of people who got the **disorder / shot** last year still got sick.

Ann: True, but I don't think we have a choice. The vaccines are mandatory. Anyway, I really don't think you can question the **effectiveness / victory** of most vaccines. A lot of diseases that people used to die from have almost disappeared. The **death rate / learning disability** from those diseases has gone down **deliberately / significantly**. Why do you think most doctors are **arbitrators / firm supporters** of vaccines?

Kim: Vaccines may be effective, but I'm not so sure about their **continuity / safety**.

Ann: Oh, come on, vaccines are safe. How many people do you know who were **harmed / hired** by vaccines?

Kim: Well, none, personally, but there's plenty of evidence that some people have been.

Ann: Yes, but that's very rare. The **benefits / tendencies** of vaccines are much greater than the risks.

Kim: That may be true, but what if your kid was the one who was **affected / cited**? Would you still think the benefit was worth the risk? It could happen, you know. Even the drug companies admit that some people have **negative reactions / unconstitutional rulings** to vaccines.

Ann: Look, I'm not a doctor. I can't **determine / reduce** if my child could be at risk. My 15 **attorney / pediatrician** recommended the vaccine and I trust her, so I'm going to take her advice. Besides, we have no choice.

Kim: I'll probably agree in the end, but I still think parents have a right to choose. I don't think anyone has the **authority / physical strength** to force parents to **consent / reverse** to a medical treatment **against their will / annually**.

Ann: Well, you'd better decide soon. By this time next week, all the kids will have gotten their shots.
