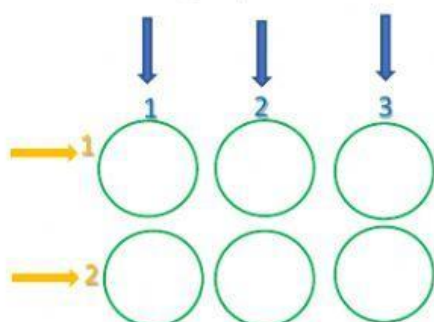


Write the number of rows and columns for each array. Then count to complete the mathematical sentence.

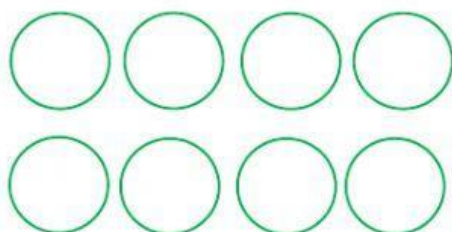
Example

Columns go up and down

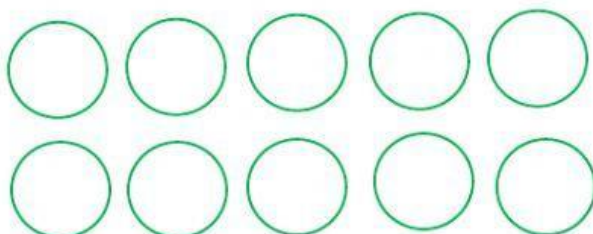


Rows go across

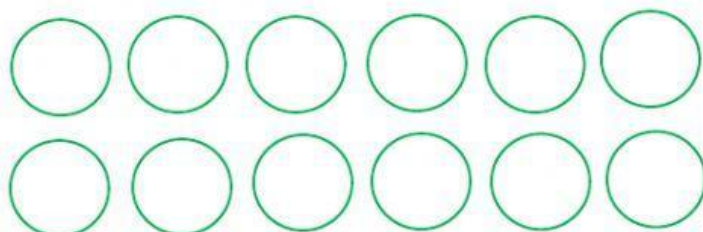

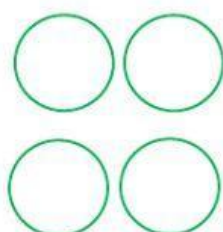
